Being Christian in the Age of Social Media

In a rapidly changing digital age, it can be hard to keep track of new technologies and platforms. Smartphones, generative AI, TikTok, and instant messaging—how do we use these in a way that is fully human? How do we glorify God in the way we use technology, especially social media?

In response to these questions of our time, the Church issued a pastoral letter last January on the use of social media. The letter offers practical guidelines for individuals, families, and communities on how to use these technologies in a truly human way. This month, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), in reflecting on this letter, has released a bilingual video series outlining key themes of the letter. The English-speaking presenter is Bishop Scott McCaig, former moderator of the



Companions of the Cross. The five videos in the series are 3-5 minutes in length, and cover the key themes of the letter, which are: 1) check for accuracy, 2) seek greater perspective, 3) value human dignity, 4) bring curiosity into the conversation, 5) distinguish between intention and impact, 6) privilege "in real life" encounters, and 7) tend to our time spent online.

As we strive to be a warmer, more vibrant missional community, it's important that we bring our faith into every area of our lives. We hope this video series sparks thought and conversation about how we use technology to glorify God, love our brothers and sisters, and bring others to Christ. 
