

TESTIMONIES FROM OUR LAST SURGE


"Testimony means that what Jesus has done for one person, he can do for me!"

Last Friday, January 10th, we gathered for our monthly Surge evening. We had over 90 people attend in person, and many more join us online. At the start of the event, the M.C. shared several words discerned by the prayer teams related to medical conditions that God wanted to heal that night. We were then blessed to have Andre Regnier share about how we have access to our Heavenly Father and how he wants to have access to us. Andre encouraged each person to be open to an encounter with God's love and mercy.

As the evening progressed, God started doing amazing things. Many people came forward for prayer ministry and several of the conditions discerned by the team beforehand were confirmed. God was at work healing and touching his people. Here is one testimony of healing that took place during the evening:

"When Peter & Vivian Sinn led

prayer ministers and worship team in prayer, Chris got a word of knowledge about God healing someone with bone cancer. My mom was just diagnosed with stage 4 bone cancer. She had pain at about level 4/10 since the radiation finished at Christmas. Peter and Meagan (my daughter, who is a prayer minister) called my mom and prayed with her, telling her the word of knowledge. She felt heat in her hip area. All the pain left! I called her this morning, and she is still painfree!"



This is just one of the incredible stories of what God is doing at St. Maurice. Here are some other testimonies:

"I needed to hear about hope and that I can access Iesus."

"I needed to hear about hope and that I can access Jesus."

"I don't want to see anything changed [at Surge]; we could worship until midnight at Surge!"


